

PART-A

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement & the outcome achieved by the end of the year: -

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG & PG) – BCA

Bachelor of Computer Applications course has been started with this academic year 2010-2011. It's a three years course affiliated to Bangalore University. 23 students have enrolled for the course for the academic year.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started:

Tally – 9.0 programme:

In association with Kayaka Computers the college conducted Tally 9.0 course for II - B.Com students. 16 students joined this add-on course. The course was spread into 60 hours (2 months, Feb - March) where both theory and practical classes were conducted for the students. During the course students were provided with tally Software CD and course materials. After the completion of the course students were awarded certificates.

Communication skills & Spoken English course:

We have also conducted another add-on course; Communication skills & Spoken English for the benefit of the students. 50 Students of B.Com, BBM, BCA and B.Sc. took the advantage of the course and enhanced their communication skills. During the course students were also trained to face the interviews and resume building.

Yoga class:

Yoga is a physical, mental and spiritual discipline originating in ancient India, whose goal is the attainment of a state of perfect spiritual insight and tranquility. Keeping this in mind the college had appointed a yoga teacher Smt. Parvathi to conduct yoga classes this year which was started in the month of July. Around 30 students joined the class. Lot of improvement could be seen in their health, concentration and discipline.

5. Examination reforms implemented:

Apart from the Bangalore University exams, the SAFGCW has a well-planned system to monitor the progress of the students. A working Committee to conduct the examinations is formed with a senior faculty member as the convener and four other staff members to help her/him in the smooth running. The Principal monitors the whole system and regular meetings are conducted. The college conducts regular monthly tests. The answer scripts are duly valued and given to the students within the stipulated period. The parents are informed about the performance of their wards. After counseling the students who are poor at studies and remain absent in the tests, remedial measures are taken by giving extra attention to them. Students are assessed by the concerned teachers by their Assignments/Project works in the respective subjects for the Internal assessment (10 marks). The system has worked effectively and a remarkable improvement is seen in the department wise results.

6. Candidates Qualified: NET/SLET/GATE: 2 of the teaching staff have appeared for the NET examination and are waiting for their results.

7. Initiative towards Faculty development program:

Mr. Rajendra Kulkarni of Xplore Consultancy conducted faculty development program on 19-01-2011. The faculty members improved their skills in communication and approach towards students. Retired Prof. Gururaj gave a talk on positive attitude and how to inculcate Indian culture among the new generation.


